In today's environment, our students face numerous demands on their time outside the classroom. One student who exemplifies the Pirate spirit and the value of an accounting degree is Evelyn Morales Rosales, our Howard Award Winner. Evelyn gave birth to a beautiful baby girl on May 1st in Raleigh and walked at graduation on May 3rd. If you ever doubted the significance of a degree to our students, Evelyn's story will change your mind.

I am particularly proud of our faculty's dedication to working with Honors College Accounting students on their Honors theses. This past spring, five of our Honors College Accounting students' Signature Honors Projects were highlighted in the NCACPA's Interim Report. These research papers require significant effort from students and their faculty mentors. No other department in the College of Business mentors its students like ours. Each year, we typically mentor 2-5 students, helping them explore complex, real-world issues through research.

Our faculty's excellence is well-known. While I am starting my 25th year, we have four faculty members who have been here even longer. Drs. Schneider, McCarthy, Schisler, and Reisch have been integral to our department and continue to be highly productive. Our program would not be where it is today without all that they have done. This year, we welcome Dr. Nikki Chappell from Florida State as a new faculty member. You can read more about her in the newsletter. However, we will be losing one of our most valuable instructors, Rachel Brassine, who has completed her DBA from Marshall University and accepted a position at Virginia Tech. Rachel has been a student favorite since she joined ECU in 2009 and has been a great colleague.

I must also mention our 6th Annual Accounting Research Gathering (ARRG!). We invited six PhD candidates from across the country to present their research at ECU. Our commitment to this annual event has been rewarding for both the department and the broader accounting community. Several years ago, Nikki Chappell participated in ARRG and loved ECU so much she came back permanently!

I am proud to share that we are experiencing unprecedented growth in our accounting program. As I am writing this letter, our 2024 fall enrollment for the BSBA is currently 408 students, and for the MSA, it is 116 students. Just three years earlier, we had 306 students in the BSBA and 51 in the MSA. Both of our programs are offered online, and this has contributed to the growth. The MSA program is attracting students from diverse educational backgrounds without any accounting

experience. This growth necessitates continual updates to our curriculum to cover new CPA exam topics and incorporate relevant technology instruction into our BSBA degree.

We have also seen increased alumni support. This past year, we awarded 66 scholarships totaling over \$205,000, up from 52 scholarships and \$121,000 in 2023. Our faculty and students are deeply grateful for your generosity. During Pirate Nation Gives, the Accounting Department received the second-highest amount of donations among all university funds. Alumni support extends beyond financial contributions, with many returning to campus to recruit and encourage prospective students to consider ECU and accounting. Active alumni engagement is vital to our community.

If I could wish for two things, it would be to award every MSA student one semester's tuition and to establish another Professorship for our faculty. If you would like to help with these initiatives, please reach out to me or see the giving information later in the newsletter.

Your accounting faculty love what we do, and we appreciate your continued interest and investment in ECU. Whether you are back on campus or watching the Pirates on TV, please drop us a note and let us know how you are doing. One of our greatest pleasures is sharing in your accomplishments.





Research

Our Students Are... Active

In the accounting department this year, we have 3 Honors College students that are completing their Signature Honors College Projects: Connor Bruss; Bryce Herring; and James Vassallo. These students were mentored by Dr. John Reisch, Dr. Cal Christian, and Dr. Zhan Furner, respectively. One requirement of these students is to present their Signature Honors College projects for an audience.

Connor Bruss

Connor Bruss and **Bryce Herring** presented their senior Honors College projects at the Society of Business, Industry, and Economics (SOBIE) conference in Destin, Florida in April. **Connor Bruss'** project entitled "Assessing the Impact: Student Perception of Athletic Fees and University Athletics Funding at East Carolina University" was mentored by **Dr. John Reisch**. **Bryce Herring** presented "Beyond the Ledger: Exploring Student Perspectives of Accounting and Investigating the Growing Shortage of Accounting Professionals," which was mentored by **Dr. Cal Christian**.

James Vassallo presented his senior Honors College, "The Role of Accounting Information in the Success of Small & Medium Enterprises (SMEs) in North Carolina," to the accounting faculty in April. This project examines what accounting knowledge is lacking in the average SME business owner in NC and how gaps here may hinder the entity's success. The results of this study show a lack of basic accounting knowledge like bookkeeping and financial statement comprehension in these business owners. Furthermore, findings revealed that most business owners studied in this limited sample were not directly involved in the accounting of their business, relying on professional CPAs instead.

Earlier this year, we had five Honors College Students' Signature Research Projects highlighted in the NCACPA's Spring 2024 Interim Report. These five students (**Jordan Anderson, Madison Cullipher, Noah Fox, Evelyn Gonzalez and Mason Hudnall**) recently graduated with their BSBA and are all pursing their MSA at ECU. These research papers examined real-world issues from exploring the underrepresentation of Hispanic Students in accounting to investigating fraud in youth sports organizations. "Investigating Fraud and Strategies to Decrease Fraud Within Youth Sports Organizations" -Mason Hudnall

Our Faculty Are... Research-Focused

ECU Accounting faculty members continue to be in the top 20% of the country for the number of Accounting cases published in totality, and in the top 30% over the last 12 years and in the last 6 years (<u>source</u>).

Dr. Cal Christian updated his CPE courses "North Carolina Accountancy Law: Ethics, Principles & Professional Responsibilities," and "North Carolina Professional Ethics." Since 2010, the accounting faculty has teamed with the NCACPA to offer online ethics courses. Through this partnership, a percentage of the revenue generated benefits ECU students enrolled in our MSA program that plan to pursue a career in public accounting.

Dr. Davidson Gillette and **Dr. Doug Schneider** co-authored, "Roth Distributions and Tax Avoidance on Social Security Benefits and Medicare Premiums," in the Journal of Financial Service Professionals (July 2024).

Dr. Davidson Gillette, along with co-authors, also has two accepted articles forthcoming in the ATA Journal of Legal Tax Research, "A Critical Analysis of the Corporate Alternative Minimum Tax," and, "Fill in the Blank? A Discussion of Prefilled Tax Returns in the U.S." Dr. Gillette was also quoted in a *Washington Post* article (link) on prefilled tax returns, titled, "The IRS has all our tax data. Why doesn't its new website use it?"

Dr. Anna Johnson, along with co-authors, has two articles forthcoming: "Decision Making by Expert Reviewers in Auditing" in the Coastal Business Journal and "Towards Auditing Firm Success: Factors That Reduce Auditors' Intention to Leave" in the Journal of Leadership Accountability and Ethics.

Dr. Mark McCarthy and **Dr. Doug Schneider** published, "Accounting Standards Codification 326: Three Years of Expected Credit Loss Reporting," in the January/February issue of The CPA Journal.

Dr. Mandi Peterson was selected as a Bureau of Business Research (BBR) Sponsored Activities Fellow this spring. This is the pilot year of this program in which interested faculty members submitted research proposals and then attend various workshops to learn to tailor these proposals toward sponsored research. The goal of the program is to encourage and educate faculty to apply for funded research opportunities.

Dr. John Reisch presented, "DEI Case Studies for Use in Accounting Courses," at the American Accounting Association's Teaching, Learning and Curriculum conference in Bethesda, MD in October. The paper is co-authored with **Dr. Mandi Peterson** and Dr. Phebian Davis-Culler from Clemson University and offers case studies focusing on diversity, equity and inclusion considerations in the accounting profession that can be introduced and addressed in the classroom. **Dr. Reisch** also presented "Investigating Fraud at Tri-County Auto: A Case Study" at the SOBIE conference in April. This manuscript is co-authored with **Dr. Dennis O'Reilly** and **Lynn Cale** (BSBA '98; MBA '00).

Dr. Dan Schisler and **Dr. Rick Niswander** (ECU retired) are co-authors of the tax textbook, "Fundamentals of Taxation," published by McGraw Hill. The book is in the 17th edition with the 18th edition expected to be published in December 2024. **Dr. Schisler** and **Dr. Niswander** are responsible for nine of the 15 chapters and overall editorial issues.

Our Faculty Are...Service-Focused

Our accounting faculty members volunteer with Greenville's Community Crossroads Center several times each year.
