	Prague, the Czech Republic The Czech Republic, also known as Czechia, is a landlocked country in Central Europe that borders the countries of Poland, Germany, Austria, and Slovakia. It is strategically located astride some of the oldest land routes in Europe. As a parliamentary democracy and a member of the European Union, Czechia has successfully transformed from a centrally planned economy to the current social market economy with its capital in Prague. Nicknamed "the City of a Hundred Spires," Prague is situated northwest of the country on the Vltava River. This magical city of bridges, cathedrals, gold-tipped towers, and church spires is the thirteenth largest city in the European Union and is home to about 1.3 million people. Since the Middle Ages, Prague has cherished the reputation of being one of the world's most beautiful cities and the political, cultural, and economic center of central Europe. Its history goes back a millennium. And the beer? The best in Europe! But this city has so much more to offer than just beer and Baroque buildings. You might be surprised that the city is a bustling hive of tech and innovation.

Some of them failed to survive the tough competition they suddenly faced, others adopted a fresh strategy and stayed at the top. morning	optional cultural event: guided tour of Prague Castle Prague Castle was most likely founded in around 880 by Prince Bořivoj of the Premyslid Dynasty (Přemyslovci). According to the Guinness Book of World Records, Prague Castle is the largest coherent castle complex in the world, with an area of almost 70,000 m². A UNESCO World Heritage site, it consists of a large-scale composition of palaces and ecclesiastical buildings of various architectural styles, from the remains of Romanesque-style buildings from the 10th century through Gothic modifications of the 14th century. This tour of Prague Castle, the largest coherent castle complex in the world, will take you through the centuries of the Old Royal Palace, St. George's Basilica, and Prague's ancient symbol, St. Vitus Cathedral.	public transport/walk
	recommended activity: Invisible Exhibition Explore the unique Invisible Exhibition! Imagine that all the lights have gone out and explore a world of darkness in this uniquely immersive experience. The Invisible Exhibition in Prague takes you on a reflective, interactive journey to an invisible world where you find your way out only by touch, sounds, and scent.	
	recommended activity: coffee scene To refill on energy, venture out to explore the booming coffee scene in Prague. Each district in Prague offers plenty of high-quality coffee shops with coffee sourced directly from the local roasteries. Try some of the places popular by locals: EMA espresso bar, Kavarna co hleda jmeno, Instagram-friendly Botanica coffee truck, or one of the many places in the Letna district: Tvaroh, Hrnek, Letka and many others.	
	recommended activity: souvenir shopping If you're looking for a classic souvenir, Bohemian crystal, with its long tradition in the country since the 16th Century, is a great option. You can also opt for beer cosmetics ranging from hair balms to shower gels and traditional spa wafers that will make a delicious souvenir! Another souvenir can be the Little Mole, invented in 1957 by the Prague cartoonist, Zdeněk Miler. Since then, he has been seen on Czech television for more than 50 years, and for more than 30 years as part of the "Mouse Broadcast" or puppets Spejbl and Hurvinek.	
	recommended activity: Kino Pilotu Kino Pilotu is a magical independent movie theatre where they show a selection of Czech and international films in four comfortable screening rooms. There is a beautiful scenic bar right next door where you can discuss the movies or meet Prague-based expats who frequently gather there.






### **UNDERSTAND**
